## Winter and Snow Safety

# January 27<sup>th</sup> is Family Literacy Day

## What We Want Our Students to Know About Reading

- ★ *that all* readers struggle with text at some time and need to learn to negotiate difficult reading situations to understand and remember what was read
- ★ that they need to figure out new vocabulary and remember key words
- ★ that they need to recognize and repair confusion
- ★ that they need to have a purpose for reading in mind
- ★ that print materials have a variety of structures and that we read these structures in different ways e.g. narratives, textbooks, poems, magazines...
- ★ that good readers use thinking strategies as well as decoding strategies - question, make connections, infer, activate prior knowledge, determine importance, visualize, summarize, synthesize
- ★ that they need to find ways to "hold" thinking - margin notes, sticky notes, highlighting, using graphic organizers
- ★ that they need to reread or adjust the pace of their reading (e.g. slow down) when reading a piece of difficult text
- ★ that they need to use text features to aid comprehension
- ★ that talking to others about their reading helps them with meaning

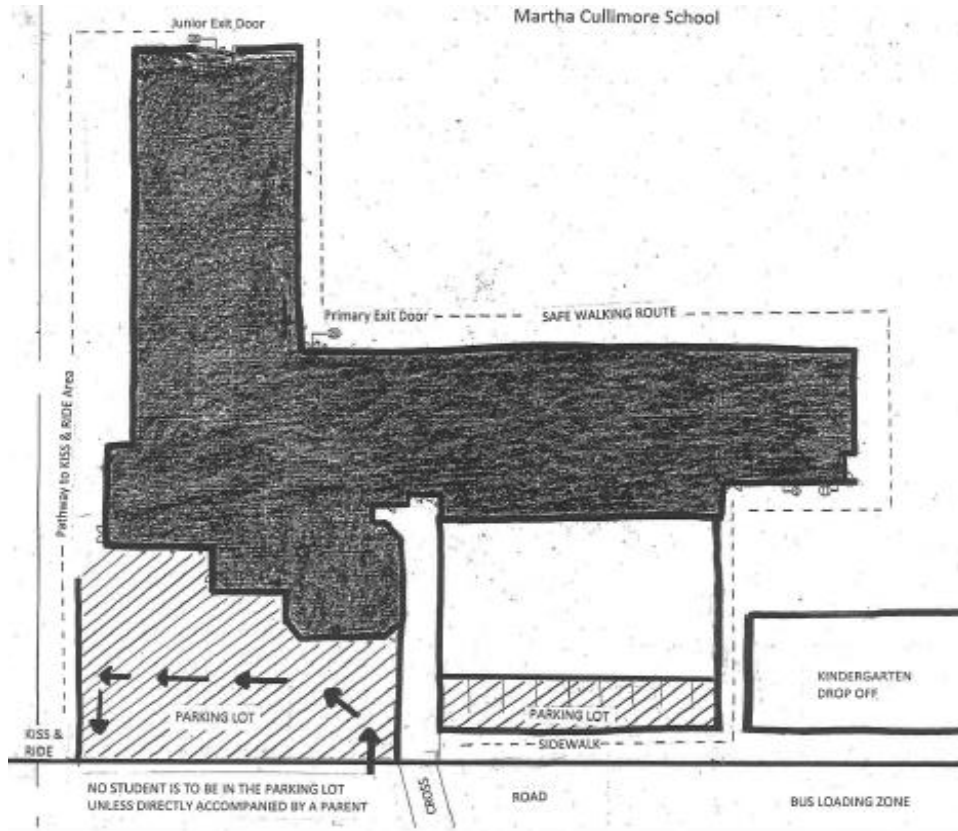
## RECIPE TIME! Ideas from ABC Life Literacy Canada...

## Parking Lot and Student Safety

We recognize that Martha Cullimore is a busy school with wonderfully involved parents. Often that means that the parking lot is busy, too! In order to ensure the safety of our students at each dismissal time, we require all visitors to our parking lot to follow parking lot guidelines:



- Students must use proper walkways and meet parents before entering the parking lot. All students must be directly supervised by parents when in the lot.
- Drivers wishing to drop students off directly onto safe sidewalk zones should use the Kiss & Ride lane through the parking lot and drop off at south end of the parking lot ONLY. There is access to a school sidewalk from that location.
- Never park in the through lane of the parking lot.
- Never park in the area adjacent to the bus lane.



Students are not permitted into the parking lot at any time without an adult. Convenience or timesaving is never worth the cost of a life. We ask that parents please meet their children at their exit doors and then escort them safely to the car. We thank you in advance for your cooperation and vigilance in ensuring the safety of our students.
